

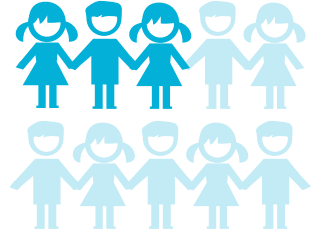
# Hunger by the Numbers
