


Who Is Impacted?

Judge's Decision

"...[T]he State Constitution requires the State to provide every student with the opportunity to obtain an education that allows them to become **prepared for career or college**." (Judge Singleton)

Multicultural Framework: PED has not given the school districts a framework to use in providing a multicultural education. The State has not implemented the NM Indian Education Act, the Hispanic Education Act, or the Bilingual Multicultural Education Act.

Effective Programs and Services: Programs like full-day PreK, extended learning time, bilingual programs and culturally and linguistically relevant education are effective, but not available to all students. The public school system fails to provide adequate special education, health and social services, instructional materials, transportation and other services.

Teachers: The state does not have a system to recruit and retain quality and diverse teachers. Low teacher pay and inadequate funds to adequately train teachers are barriers.

Funding & Accountability: Funding is inadequate for all districts, and the PED has failed to assure that funds are spent to provide "at-risk" students with needed programs and services.

*Education is a right and lack of funds is not a defense for violating this right.



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
